1. Empowering Artists & Creative Voices

2. Connecting Communities, Creating Friendships, and Learning from one another

HablaNashville program : this was a 9-week program that facilitated the encounter between people learning Spanish-English to practice the language, have a cultural exchange, and possibly build friendships. The one-hour, 25-minute online meeting sessions allowed the parties to share their language knowledge while reflecting on their professional and personal lives. We involved mentors and 2 institutions for their help and expertise teaching English at the Intensive English center at TSU and Voces de Nashville.



Tennessee State University Intensive English Center, whose leadership in content development, program coordination, mentor preparation, and hosting the kickoff meeting brought academic excellence to the program.

Voces de Nashville, whose commitment to community empowerment, Spanish-learning resources, syllabus review, program promotion, and hosting the closing event ensured a rich, multicultural experience.

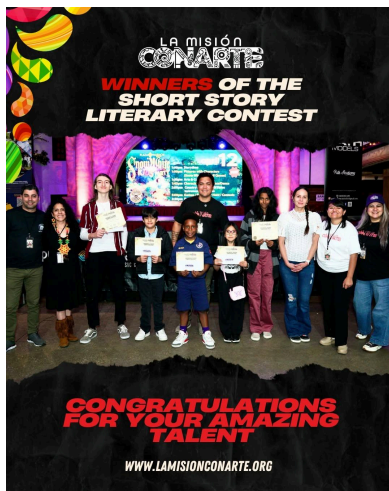

I. ABC Workshop (with Love Me)

A. A Short Story literary contest

2025 CONTARTE Nashville: Children’s Literary Short Story Contest As part of the inaugural International Storytelling Festival held from April 10–12, 2025, La Misión ConArte successfully launched the *CONTARTE Nashville* short story contest. Designed to foster creativity among the youth of Nashville and its surrounding areas, the initiative invited participants aged 8–17 to submit original works in either English or Spanish. The event was a resounding success, bringing together 30 young writers, 5 generous sponsors, and 2 featured artists. We were proud to recognize 8 talented winners, who were awarded a total of \$1,200 in prizes, marking a significant milestone in our commitment to promoting literacy and artistic expression within our community.

Workshop Highlight: Transforming Stories into Textile Art

In partnership with *Love Me* and *Crei TN*, *La Misión ConArte* proudly hosted an exclusive textile art workshop series for the winners of the *ContARTE Nashville 2025* Short Story Contest. Held at the Nashville Public Library (Southeast Branch) and led by renowned textile artist Marcela Castaño, this program provided eight young participants with a unique space to transcend traditional storytelling. Over four sessions, students reimagined scenes from their winning stories using yarns, textures, and colors, successfully translating their written narratives into vibrant, tangible art pieces. By showcasing these works in key cultural venues across Nashville, the initiative empowered these young creators to find new forms of expression, ultimately fostering confidence, pride, and a deeper sense of identity. This collaborative effort serves as a

testament to our ongoing commitment to uplifting the voices of the Latin American diaspora through transformative arts education.

D. Writing Workshop for adults InmigrART stories - collaboration with Hijos de Inmigrantes

Workshop Highlight: Inmigr Art: America's Voices

Last year, La Misión ConArte hosted *Inmigr Art: America's Voices*, a free online workshop dedicated to empowering children of immigrants living in the United States. Designed as a creative outlet for storytelling and community building, the program provided a unique space for participants to connect through their shared experiences. The session was led by international facilitator Denisse Sandoval, who joined us from Mexico to guide our cohort of 14 participants. By fostering self-expression and cultural connection, this initiative successfully fulfilled our mission to amplify diverse voices and provide meaningful artistic opportunities for our community.

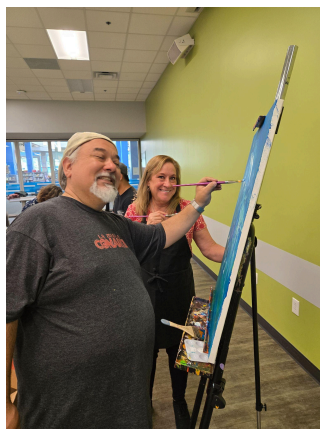

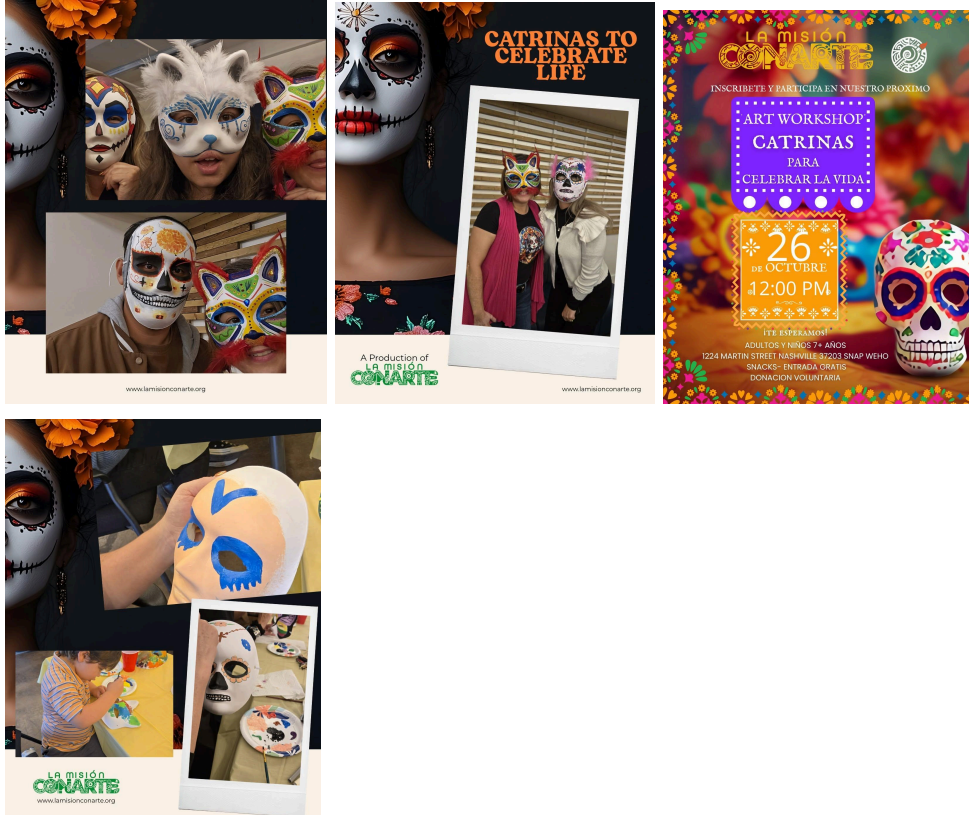

In October 2025, La Misión ConArte hosted the "Catrinas to Celebrate Life" workshop, a vibrant cultural initiative held at SNAP WeHo in Nashville. This event served as a powerful bridge between tradition and community, providing an inclusive space for both children and adults to honor their roots through creative expression. By offering free access to arts education, the program successfully fostered intergenerational connection and cultural pride. The initiative left a meaningful impact on our community, directly benefiting 20 participants and supported by the dedicated efforts of 2 professional artists and 3 volunteers. Through this celebration of life, La Misión ConArte continues to strengthen social ties and promote the accessibility of the arts within the Nashville community.

I. ABC Workshop (with Love Me)

ABC Workshop: Fostering Creativity Through Cultural Connection In partnership with *Love Me*, La Misi3n ConArte successfully hosted an engaging hands-on arts workshop at the ABC Academy in Nashville, the inaugural location of the ABC Spanish Immersion Program. This initiative provided a meaningful space for students to explore their creativity through manual arts, reinforcing the importance of cultural and artistic expression in early education. With the dedicated support of four volunteers and the guidance of a professional artist, the workshop successfully served nine participants. This impact-driven collaboration highlighted our commitment to nurturing young talent and strengthening our community outreach programs in Nashville.

CreArte 2025 Seeds and Roots

2025 Highlight: The “Semillas y Raíces” (Seeds and Roots) Initiative

In 2025, La Misión ConArte successfully launched “Semillas y Raíces,” a transformative creative arts competition designed to honor the resilience of the Latin American diaspora. By inviting participants aged 15 and older to explore their heritage through video, photography, and literature, we provided a vital platform for individuals to process the complexities of migration, displacement, and cultural identity. The impact of this initiative was significant: beyond engaging 40 active participants and awarding over \$5,000 in prizes to 15 winners, the project fostered a deep sense of belonging and community pride. With the support of 10 dedicated coordinators and a 20-member expert jury, the program culminated in an awards ceremony that reached 150 in-person attendees and garnered 700 streaming views. “Semillas y Raíces” stands as a testament to our ongoing commitment to empowering artists and strengthening the cultural roots that allow our community to flourish in a new land.

10 event coordinators, 40 participants, 5 adult winners, 10 children's winners, 20 jury members in the different categories, 150 people from the community attending the awards ceremony, streaming of the event with 700 views of the event, more than \$5,000 in prizes for the winners.

2025 Book Fair: A Celebration of Literacy and Culture

On April 12th, La Misión ConArte hosted a vibrant Book Fair at Plaza Mariachi, bringing together over 500 attendees for an immersive celebration of the written and spoken word. This event served as a powerful catalyst for cultural connection, featuring international storytellers, the Nashville Public Library, and the “Art in Motion for Peace, Love & Unity” fashion show. The fair provided a vital platform for the literary community, successfully promoting 13 local authors and fostering a love for reading through the Book Sip Club’s interactive activities. A cornerstone of the day was the Short Story Literary Contest, which empowered the next generation of writers by recognizing the creativity of our youth. With 50 children actively engaged in the "Kids Tent" and eight young authors honored during the award ceremony, the event left a lasting impact by nurturing imagination and strengthening our community’s commitment to education, diversity, and the arts.
